**Indian Institute of Technology dhArwAD** (IITdh) is one of the third Generation (3-G) IITs, which were established by the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India (GoI). It was started in August 2016 under the mentorship of IIT Bombay. Our academic journey began in the Academic Year (AY) 2016-17, with the establishment of four-year Bachelor of Technology (B. Tech.) programs – in Mechanical Engineering (ME), Electrical Engineering (EE) and Computer Science & Engineering (CSE).

Currently our Institute offers four other B. Tech. programs - Engineering Physics (EP), Mathematics & Computing (M&C), Civil & Infrastructure Engineering (C&IE), Chemical & Biochemical Engineering (C&BE) as well as a five-year Bachelor of Science-Master of Science (BS-MS) program, a two-year Master of Technology (M. Tech.) Program and a Master of Science (MS) Program offered by the three oldest Departments of Mechanical, Materials & Aerospace Engineering (MMAE); Electrical, Electronics & Communication Engineering (EECE) and CSE. Our Ph.D. program is offered by all the ten Departments [which also include the other seven Departments of Bio Science & Bio Engineering (BSBE), Chemical Engineering (ChE), Chemistry, C&IE, Humanities, Economics, Arts and Rural Technologies (HEART), Mathematics and Physics].

Presently, IIT dhArwAD accommodates around 1,335 students, with around 20% being women. This diverse student body hails from 20 states/ Union territories (UTs) out of the 36 states/ UTs across the country. Among them, around 20% are pursuing Masters and Doctoral degrees. Our academic community with a strength of 92 regular and 12 other faculty members has been successful in securing significant research and development projects, executing sponsored consultancy projects, and publishing hundreds of scientific manuscripts in reputed journals and conference proceedings. 



Participants were invited from various institutions across the country from IITs, IISCs, IISERs, BITS, AIIMS, XLRI, NIITs, NGOs, IIMs. This workshop was executed with the idea to find practical tools and techniques to manage stress in educational institutes' workplace to improve mental wellbeing and to know about the various mechanisms being utilized by other institutions to handle the mental well-being of students.</p> <p>Emergency situations: To deal with situations related to student wellness and/or mental health, the Office of Dean Student Affairs, IIT Delhi has at least one faculty member and one counsellor available for any emergency situation 24x7 - normally, the response time is within 15-30 minutes of any emergency at any time.</p> <p>In general, the Board of Student Welfare (BSW) spearheads all efforts aimed at assisting student wellness and addressing mental health issues.</p> <p>In addition to being led by an elected student General Secretary, the board is mentored by several faculty members, with the Associate Dean Student Welfare (ADSW) serving as the President of the Board.</p> <p>Below are some measures, along with plans:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. We currently have a total of 10 counsellors in the campus available 24x7.</li> <li>2. Hostel counsellors including Night counsellors are also made available for the students which has given students a choice to avail of counselling services within the hostels and in the nights as well.</li> <li>3. External firm has been engaged by IIT Delhi for tele/online counselling services for students.</li> <li>4. A psychiatrist is available in IIT Delhi hospital for students to avail of any kind of psychiatric support. We are also exploring the possibility of having a permanent psychiatrist available in the IIT Delhi hospital.</li> <li>5. Students who are uncomfortable in availing counselling services within campus are given appointments through our centre to listed hospitals for accessing psychiatric and psychological help and support with the first session being reimbursed for the students. Tie-up is done with private hospitals such as Max, Fortis, Vimsnas to facilitate and assist students.</li> <li>6. We have student mental health coordinator. We plan to create a team of student mental health mentors who would directly work with and report to counsellors and ADSW.</li> <li>7. Talk show and workshops on mental health, self discovery, stress management, time management etc. are held regularly.</li> <li>8. We run general and academic mentorship programs operated by BSW.</li> <li>9. We have language assistance and language services, at UG and PG levels, which are both curricular (co- and extra-) in nature and independent of curricula.</li> </ol> <p>Proposals for expansion/modification of these from simply linguistic to STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics) communication are in preparation.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>10. We regularly organise co- and extra- curricular activities like Yoga and Meditation sessions for the wellness of IIT Delhi students and community.</li> <li>11. We support in enhancing outside the classroom interactions amongst students and faculty through increased frequency of dinners/gatherings under the aegis of Student Teacher Interaction Council operating under BSW.</li> <li>12. Outreach to, and collaboration with, parents/families of students identified with serious mental health challenges requiring assistance from parents/families is done. We inform them timely in this reference for immediate action/support.</li> <li>13. We also plan to create a student wellness centre where regular meditation, yoga and breathing exercise workshops would take place and students can take part anytime.</li> <li>14. Over and above, the ADSW office works one to one with large number of students to cater for their anxiety and stress through one-to-one discussion and occasional classes on stress management if sponsored by AICTE or any other funding body.</li> </ol> <p>In addition to the above the following are also operational at the Institute level:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 6	<b>IIT Guwahati</b>	<p>The Center for Holistic well-being, IITG organizes suicide postvention activities on the campus. Debriefing sessions are held at all the hostels wherein the counsellors present addressed the queries and concerns and provided resources to help them cope with the incident. Grief counselling sessions are scheduled with those who were observed to be more affected.</p> <p>Information on the mental health resources available on campus and online were circulated amongst the student body. The peers have been provided with the necessary tools required to handle and be sensitive to their mentees.</p> <p>Ice breaking sessions are organized at the onset of an academic year to help ease the transition into college life and academia. Other activities such as the open house sessions, life skills workshops and talks by experts are held periodically to assist and equip students with the right coping skills.</p> <p>The 'Declutter' series which includes a compilation queries/ issues faced by students. These are posted on a safe online platform anonymously. The counsellors then attend to them by providing inputs and encouraging them for sessions should the need arise.</p> <p>A suicide death can affect those beyond the immediate loss survivors and ripple outward, impacting others and even an entire community. The center is keen to adopt comprehensive approach to address the risk and protective factors that will impact the students on campus in collaboration with the various stakeholders such as the hostel caretakers &amp; wardens, faculty, administration and health care center.</p>	<p>There are 4 nos of students' counsellors in IIT Guwahati</p>

The counsellor's approachable presence helps normalise conversations around mental health and ensures that students are aware of support options from the start of their journey.</li> <li>2. Induction Mentorship Programme: It is an initiative for new entrants to help them transition smoothly into campus life. Each new entrant is paired with mentors (student &amp; faculty) who serve as their initial friends on campus, which is in line with the vision of SAKHA. In addition to helping them navigate academics, extracurriculars, and the college structure, the mentors are trained to identify early signs of emotional or mental distress. By serving as initial friends on campus, mentors create a peer support system, easing feelings of loneliness or anxiety and ensuring that new students feel connected and cared for from day one.</li> <li>3. Mental Wellness Week: Celebrated during World Mental Health Day, this week-long event is dedicated to promoting student well-being through educational sessions, mindfulness workshops, and open discussions about mental health. Each message is crafted to foster mental well-being by encouraging small, achievable "wins" that boost self-esteem and promote a positive mindset. By starting the day with encouraging content, the community helps reinforce the value of mindfulness and self-care in daily life, contributing to a healthier, more connected campus environment. It also serves as a platform to remind students about available mental health resources, such as counselling services, providing weekly updates on how they can seek support.</li> <li>5. Remedial Classes: These remedial classes provide targeted support to new students preparing for their first college exams, focusing on enhancing conceptual clarity and problem-solving skills. Sophomore Academic Mentors, who excel in these courses, lead the sessions, simplifying complex topics and guiding students through challenging problems. With support from research scholars and guidance from professors, the classes ensure a thorough understanding of the subject matter. By addressing academic concerns and reducing exam-related stress, these sessions alleviate a major contributor to mental health struggles. Academic mentors are also trained to offer emotional support, fostering a welcoming environment where students feel comfortable seeking help without fear of judgment.</li> <li>6. Acing Placement and Acing Internships: Preparing for internships and placements can be a source of considerable stress for final-year and pre-final-year students. This series of guidance sessions is structured to ease that pressure by offering tailored advice on critical areas such as Software Development Engineering (SDE), Data Analytics (DA), Data Science (DS), Core Engineering fields, and Product Management. By addressing the mental strain accompanying this pivotal time, the program ensures students are well-prepared, technically and mentally equipped to handle the pressure and uncertainties of the recruitment process.</li> </ol> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 21-Day Habit Challenge: A program designed to help students adopt new habits and create positive and lasting change like Digital Detox, Book Reading, Yoga and Meditation, Physical Activity: Gym, Jogging, Morning Walks etc., Maintaining a proper morning routine and consistent sleep schedule before the beginning of every New Year.</li> <li>2. HeartOut: The one-stop platform to share feelings, emotions, and experiences!
